

## Pritchett's hot streak continues

Trevor Pritchett, a 19-year-old cutter from Quinlan, Texas, has been on a winning streak ever since he qualified for the 2013 State High School cutting finals and realized he might have a future in the sport.

He won the Texas High School finals last summer, then finished seventh in the NHSRA Finals, and then won the NYCHA Senior Youth Rookie of the Year Award at the 2014 NCHA Summer Spectacular.

On Thursday, he added the Mercuria NCHA \$5,000 Novice Non-Pro World Finals to his resume.

Riding Shaka Red Feather, Pritchett put together go-rounds of 215 and 216 to lead the non-working finals at 431. That gave him World Finals earnings of \$2,851.50 and the show championship. Dusty Morrison and Trojan Cat placed second in the World Finals with \$2,762.50.

Shaka Red Feather is a 9-year-old mare by Cats Red Feather out of Zacks Little Hickory, bred by Bill and Tena Neely. She has earned over \$40,000.

Pritchett and Shaka Red Feather finished the year with \$15,730 in earnings, good for eighth place in the World standings.

The World Championship went to Steve Norris of Colorado Springs on Innovation Time, with earnings of \$44,475. They earned money at 72 shows during the year.

Bred by Double Dove Ranch, Innovation Time is a 7-year-old by One Time Pepto out of Sweet Shorty Lena, the dam of earners of \$886,000 including Spots Hot (\$502,000). Innovation Time was shown by Adan Banuelos and Vincenzo Vario through his limited age career, and had earned over \$132,000 prior to the Mercuria NCHA World Finals.

Heidi Colclasure and Cats Sugarshine, by Cats Moonshine, took the Reserve World Championship with earnings of \$25,522.
